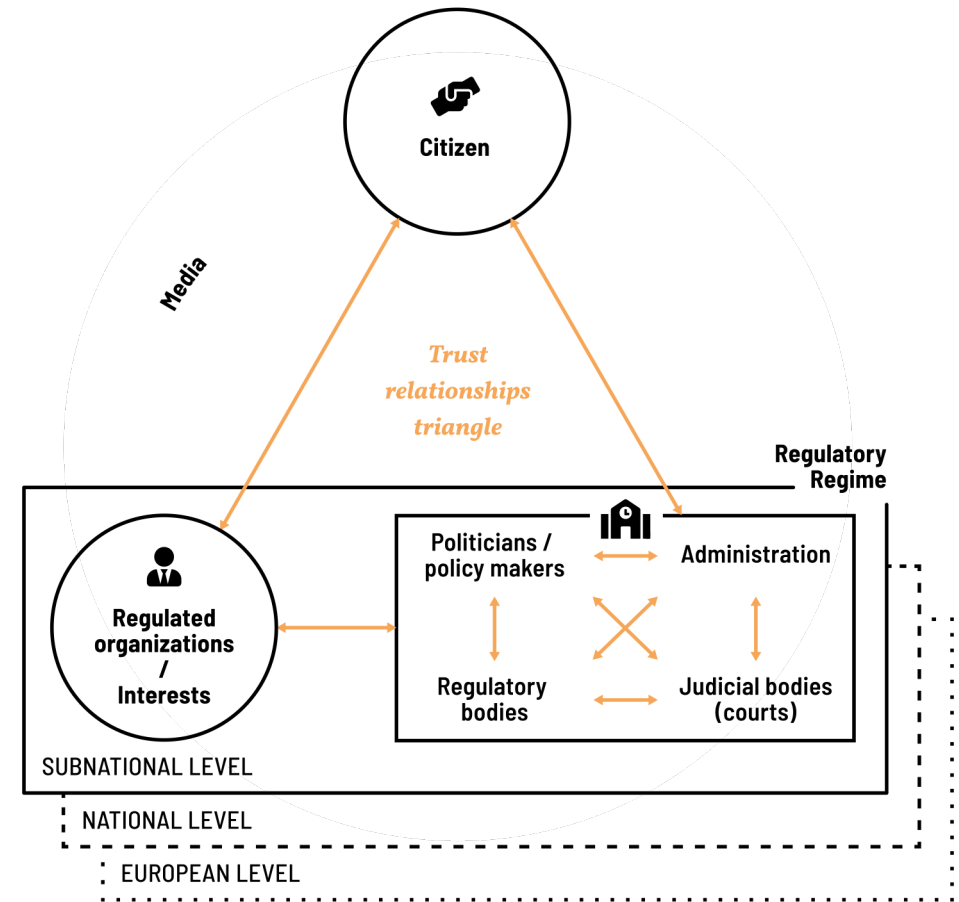

TiGRE studies trust and distrust in regulatory regimes: causes, dynamics and effects

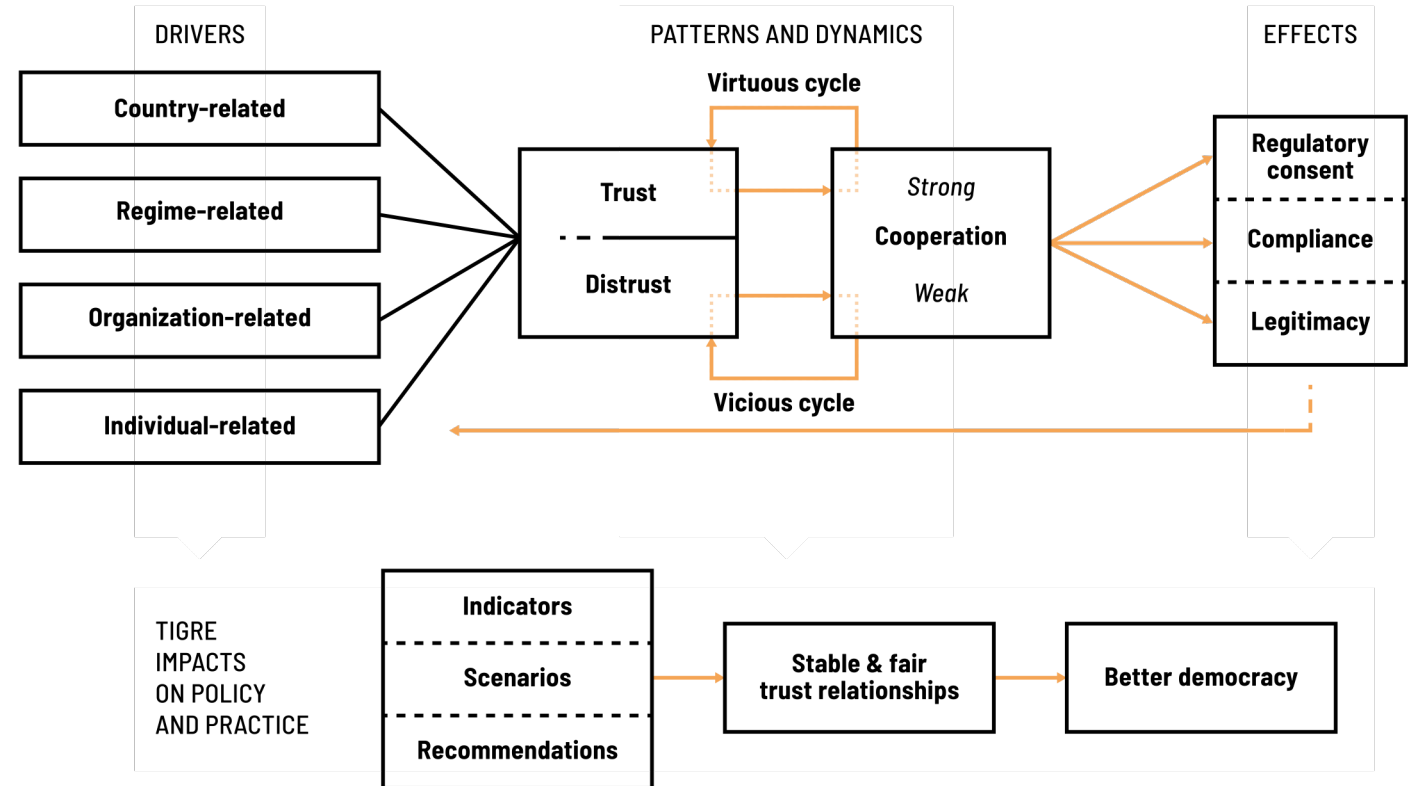
- From citizens in the regulatory regime
- Between actors within the regulatory regime



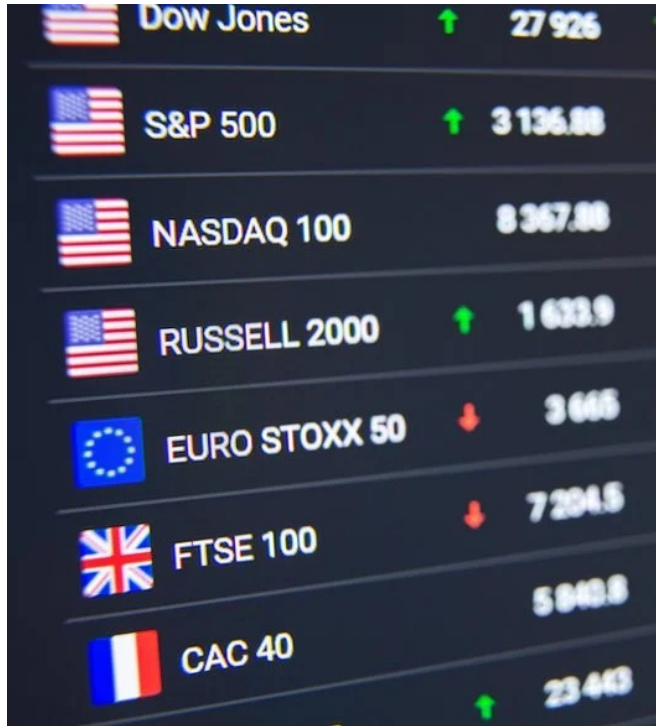
# TiGRE conceptual-analytical scheme

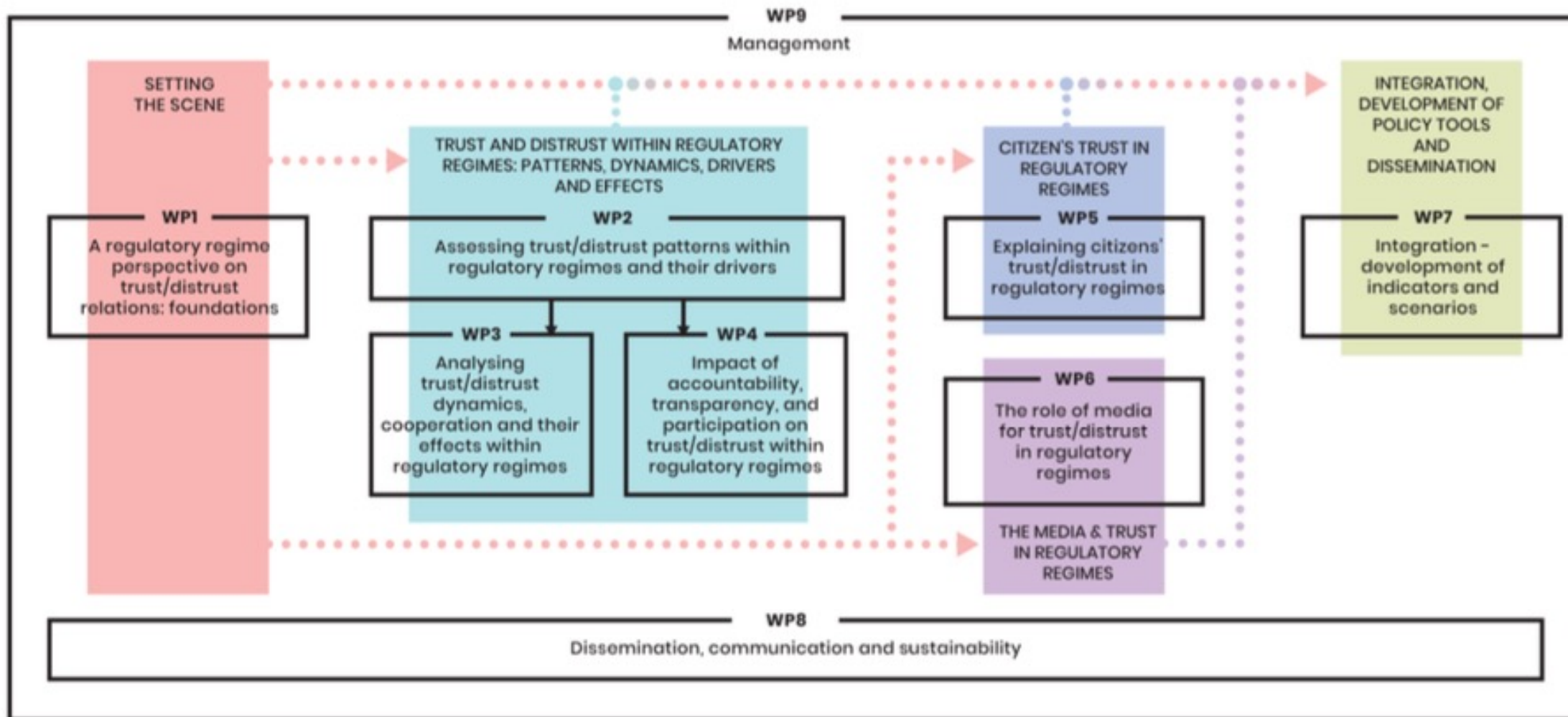
